

In the News

In response to a number of terrorist plots against Israelis by the PLO, the Israeli cabinet voted yesterday to impose the death penalty on convicted terrorists. The decision follows the deaths of 4 Israelis in a PLO attack on a coastal town last week and a foiled plot by terrorists in the Brussels airport. The death penalty had been illegal in Israel since 1954.

A study by the National Cancer Institute has determined that the drug reserpine (the generic name) has been found to cause cancer in laboratory rats. The study results are still preliminary, and there is no evidence yet that the drug will cause cancer in humans. Reserpine is used by millions of Americans to control high blood pressure. Doctors are cautioning patients not to stop the use of the drug, considering the fact that the dangers of high blood pressure are more real than the chances of contracting cancer.
