In the News

A crowd of more than 60,000 people attended Sunday's anti-nuclear rally in Washington, DC, the largest such demonstration in America's history. The huge crowd assembled south of the White House and then marched to the Capitol carrying banners and chanting, "No more Harrisburgs" and "Shut 'em down!" The protesters heard from Robert Pollard, a former employee of the Nuclear Regulatory Commission who said that the public is "being lied to when you are told safety requirements are being met . . . that nuclear plant accidents are unlikely . . . and that there is a safe method for storing nuclear waste." Ralph Nader and Jane Fonda were also present at the rally.

After her election victory to become the first woman prime minister in British and European history, Margaret Thatcher began chosing her cabinet. To eliminate internal dissention, former Prime Minister Edward Heath was excluded as she picked cabinet heads to try to lead

Britain away from the rising tide of socialism.
