In the News

As Americans are plunging into another energy crisis related to the continuing gasoline allocations and supply reductions, President Carter faces Congress with his second energy package of the year. One facet of the plan calls for the phasing out of domestic crude oil prices; another facet deals with the idea that nuclear energy can be a safe and viable alternative to oil. Energy from nuclear breeder reactors is one goal of the plan.

Despite the Israeli-Egyptian peace treaty in effect, guerrila and terrorist raids continue in the Middle East. For the third straight day, Israeli warplanes attacked Palestinian camps in southern Lebanon in retaliation for terrorist raids into Israel. Meanwhile, Israeli Prime Minister Menachem Begin proposed peace to Lebanon, but Lebanese President Elias Sarkis immediately refused to negotiate.
