In the News

- The SALT II pact between the Soviet Union and the United States has been reached, and a summit between President Carter and Leonid Brezhnev for the formal signing may be held as early as mid-June. Carter has already begun campaigning for Senate passage: "It's a fair treaty. There is no advantage to either country." A final vote on ratification may not be taken until October.
- The Senate yesterday passed President Carter's standby gas rationing plan with the qualification that he only use it in absolute national emergency. Proponents of the plan warn against a possible fuel supply interruption; opponents vilify the immense cost of a program which most probably will always be on the shelf.
