- In his continuing plea to the Senate for SALT II ratification, President Carter said that failure to ratify the treaty "will sever, to a substantial degree, the workable relationship between ourselves and the Soviets." The treaty will be signed in Vienna in mid-June by Carter and Leonid Brezhnev. Ratification will require approval by two-thirds of the Senate.
- Tanzanian and exiled Ugandan troops continue their slow march through Uganda finding little resistance in parts of the country still under control of Idi Amin's troops. Although only 3,000 to 10,000 men are still Amin Loyalists, a final showdown between the two enemy factions may not come for several weeks.
- Evidence is mounting concerning possible financial discrepancies and misdeeds on Jimmy Carter's road to the Presidency. Not only does some information point to wrongdoing in campaign financing, but also in Carter's recent tax returns and in Bert Lance's financial transactions. So far the accumulated data is disjointed and by no means proof of any premeditated deceit.
