

In the News

More grim news is in store for the United States and other heavy oil importing countries: both Venezuela and Iran are raising their crude oil prices by 60¢ a barrel or more. Some members of OPEC are also pressing for a price increase on top of the April 9% rise and the various surcharges presently in effect. The current price for a barrel of crude runs between \$14.54 (Saudi Arabia) to \$17.17 (Iran - Light crude).

A bill has just passed overwhelmingly in the Senate to grant \$4.8 billion in economic and military aid to Egypt and Israel since the signing of the Middle East peace agreement has taken place. Three-fourths of the money is earmarked, and the military credits are loans to be repaid within 40 years. The bill is expected to also pass in the House although neither Egypt nor Israel has ratified their peace treaty.
