In the News

Insiders of the Bolshoi ballet troupe report that Ludmila Vlasova, whose husband Alexander Godunov defected to the US last month, regrets her decision to return to Russia. They say that her ballet contemporaries feel that Ludmila "sold her soul for her career" by agreeing to return to Russia in exchange for more important ballet parts. The dancers are reported to be ostracizing the good but not great ballerina.

At a "town meeting" in Steubenville, Ohio led by President Carter, concern was expressed by local coal miners that Carter's energy plans for coal were promising for the future but not for their immediate situation. Many miners are unemployed since high-sulfur coal mines have been shut down due to buyers' high inventories and many laws preventing the burning of the high-sulfur (air-polluting) coal. Carter often raised a contingent point that Ohio is the only state not having an EPA-approved environmental plan.
