In the News

Totally against a strike this year, General Motors and the United Auto Workers bargained for 25 hours to settle on a tentative contract before midnight last Friday, the strike deadline. If union locals approve the 3-year contract (including large pension benefits, a cost of living raise, and a 3% wage increase per year), a strike will be averted for the first time since 1964.

With timber in California bone-dry from the rainless summer, brush fires this week have destroyed almost 9,000 acres in Los Angeles County. The unyielding summer heat and dry winds have also complicated the problem of smog, the worst in the last quarter century in Los Angeles. Weekend activities and local sports events were cancelled on Saturday due to its severity. Shifting winds, however, have lessened the problem since the weekend.
