The Federal Reserve Board yesterday raised the prime interest rate to a record 11%. The prime rate is the interest rate the Federal Reserve charges to its member banks and is the bellwether for all future local bank rates. Inflation continued to push the gold market to new heights as the price for an ounce of gold reached a new record high of \$375. The price of gold has automatically risen as each new shipment of gold reaches the market.
