State Dept. veteran official Donald McHenry was sworn in yesterday as the new United States Ambassador to the United Nations. His predecessor, Andrew Young, spoke on an ABC television program yesterday and said that Carter's support among the black community was "tremendous" and that Senator Edward Kennedy probably would not challenge Carter in 1980. Thousands of anti-nuclear protestors assembled near the World Trade Center in New York yesterday, calling for the shutdown of all nuclear power plants in America. The demonstrators heard speeches by Bella Abzug, Ralph Nader, and Jane Fonda, and listened to music performed by Pete Seeger, Graham Nash, Jesse Colin Young, Tom Paxton, and Bonnie Raitt.
