## In the News

The House of Representatives yesterday voted a 5.5% pay increase for members of Congress and other high-ranking American officials. Congressional salaries will go up to \$60,662 a year if the major appropriation bill, of which this legislation is a part, is passed. The Senate approved legislation implementing the Panama Canal Treaty yesterday. The House is expected to approve the legislation later this week, just in time for the treaties to go into effect on Monday, October 1.
