Pope John Paul II celebrated mass for about 200,000 people on the Washington Mall yesterday in Washington, DC. During an address in Washington, the Pope reaffirmed his view that abortion under any circumstance is wrong. He also heard a plea by Sister Theresa Kane for Catholic women to have full priestly rights, a privilege the Pope says is not God's Will. Protestors tried to take over the Seabrook Nuclear Power plant in New Hampshire for the second day yesterday. State troopers repelled the 1,500 protestors with billy clubs and mace. There have been several arrests and injuries reported.
