IN THE NEWS

Cuban President Fidel Castro arrived in New York Thursday under very heavy security. This visit is his first in 19 years. He will address the General Assembly of the United Nations on Friday. When asked about the 1,800 US Marines on their way to Guantanamo Base in Cuba, Castro said, "They're spending a lot of the US taxpayers' money and not solving any problems." Senior Georgian Senator Herman Talmadge yesterday became the first Senator in History to be "denounced" officially by the Senate. His "reprehensible" conduct concerns allegations that he turned campaign contributions to personal use and filed \$50,000 worth of false expense claims. The Justice Department is also investigating the matter. Oil and gas prices are rising again with Kuwait and Mexico initiating the increases. Transportation Secretary Neil Goldschmidt predicts imported oil will cost US consumers a record \$77 billion next year, up \$20 billion from 1979. He says one-third of our inflation rate increase is due to higher oil prices.
