

In the News

The likelihood of a showdown for the Democratic Presidential nomination between President Carter and Massachusetts Senator Edward Kennedy increased yesterday when Kennedy's press secretary announced that a "Kennedy for President" Committee would be set up, possibly as early as next week. The committee will serve as an "exploratory body" through which Kennedy can raise money and supporters. At the present time, Senator Kennedy has not announced whether or not he will be a candidate for the Presidency in 1980.

HEW Secretary Patricia Harris yesterday directed the Chicago School Board to create a satisfactory school desegregation plan for the city within ten days or face federal prosecution. Harris stated that the "vast majority of Chicago public school children still attend segregated public schools". Meanwhile, Cleveland's 5,000 public school teachers went on strike yesterday, demanding higher pay increases in their proposed contracts. Administrators and substitute teachers tried to fill in for the striking teachers.
