

In the News

The government of Israeli Prime Minister Menachem Begin yesterday easily beat five no-confidence challenges in the Knesset. The action by Parliament came as a result of the resignation of Moshe Dayan as Foreign Minister on Sunday and the ruling by the Israeli High Court that Elon Moreh, the civilian Israeli settlement on the West Bank, was to be dismantled because the land had been settled illegally by Begin's government. According to Geneva and Hague Conventions, a conquering nation may not transfer civilians for settlement purposes to conquered land; only temporary settlements spawned by the military are allowed. West Bank Arab property owners immediately praised the Knesset's act.
