In the News

Senator Edward Kennedy's Presidential Campaign, which will be officially declared November 7, gained support yesterday when Iowa Senator Dick Clark resigned as the Carter Administration's Coordinator for Refugee Affaires in order to organize Kennedy's Iowa campaign. In Chicago, Mayor Jane Byrne officially endorsed Kennedy for President yesterday, calling him the "bright star" of the Democratic Party. Finally, the 70,000 member National Treasury Employees Union also endorsed Kennedy, stating that Carter had failed to treat federal employees with fairness.

On the 50th anniversary of the stock market crash, thousands of anti-nuclear demonstrators swarmed over offices in Washington, DC; a submarine base in Washington state; and Wall and Broad Streets in New York City. Though the demonstrators failed to close the New York Stock Exchange, the protest against corporate involvement in nuclear industry was heartily made while bands played and clowns marched around on stilts. The demonstrations were peaceful, but over 1,000 arrests were make, including Daniel Ellsberg, the antiVietnam War figure of the 1960's who made public the Pentagon Papers.
