# In the News

Due to higher than expected tax revenues, the 1979 government deficit is \$27.7 billion, almost \$10 billion lower than calculated previously. Now an embarrassed Congress finds itself voting to increase the estimated 1980 deficit although it had said this deficit would be lower than that of 1979. Supporters of the balanced budget theory are pleased with the 1979 figure but not the proposed 1980 sum. Governor Edmund Brown, Jr. of California is seeking to have a constitutional convention pass an amendment to balance the budget and may make a committment to a balanced budget if he is nominated for President by the Democrats.

A State Department summary stating that "war, genocide, famine, and epidemic disease have struck Cambodia" continues the fight to aid the survivors of a country in turmoil. Secretary of State Cyrus Vance will attend a special UN meeting today on the Cambodian crisis. He will stress the need for over 330 million pounds of food to be delivered, airfields to be constructed, and an air—sea lift to be begun. The UN meeting will also try to persuade the Vietnamese conquerers of Cambodia to allow the aid to be quickly disseminated within the country.
