In the News

President Carter yesterday cancelled his scheduled trip to Canada, stating that he had decided to stay in Washington to monitor the developments concerning the American hostages being held in the US Embassy in Tehran by Iranian students. Special US envoys, Ramsey Clark and William Miller, suspended their journey to Iran after Khomeini rejected negotiations with them over release of the hostages. A representative of the PLO met with Iranian leaders in Tehran yesterday regarding a possible PLO mediator role. US officials say that help from any party in finding a resolution to the conflict would be welcomed. However, the PLO first is awaiting an invitation from Washington, whose policy is to have no direct contact with the guerrila organization. Meanwhile, American backlash against Iran and Iranian students studying in this country is growing; flag burning, protesting, and jeering at Iranian students have been numerous recent occurrences.
