

In the News

Frustrated by a stalemate in the US Embassy in Tehran where over 60 American hostages are being held for the 9th day by irate Iranian students, President Carter has countered the situation with an order to the attorney general and the Justice Department to identify and to deport Iranian students residing illegally in this country. Carter hopes to prevent further Iranian student demonstrations here and more American backlash which would hamper efforts to release the American hostages. US officials are trying to reduce the intense emotional fervor in this country as world opinion becomes more and more favorable for us. As angry American students continue to protest here against the tense situation in Iran, about 50 Iranian students occupied the garden of the US Embassy in Beirut, Lebanon yesterday, overwhelming the Lebanese security guards. The students said they would not take hostages; they wish only to make a symbolic protest against the unwillingness of the US to return the Shah to Iran.

Over 50,000 people were evacuated yesterday from a 25-square-mile area around a Toronto, Canada, suburb after the derailment of a freight train carrying tanks of poisonous chlorine gas. By late afternoon, officials said they could find no evidence of lethal gas in the air, but would not speculate as to when the thousands of evacuees could return to their homes.

Rosalynn Carter flew home Saturday after a 2-day tour of Thai border camps of thousands of diseased and starving Cambodian refugees. Reporting the situation "inconceivable" and heart-rending, the First Lady pledged that America will try its best to offer as much aid as possible. Delivery of emergency supplies and food to the refugees is improving but is still inadequate.
