## In the News

Iran requested an emergency meeting of the United Nations Security Council yesterday, saying the United States is "pushing the world to the brink or war" by not returning the Shah of Iran, a so-called criminal, to his native country. The Iranian government also banned all American planes from Iranian airspace. The two actions come on the heels of President Carter's ordered suspension of all oil imports from Iran as of Monday. Spot shortages in home heating oil this winter should, however, only be temporary because of this order, says Energy Secretary Charles Duncan. Meanwhile, no progress has been made to secure the release of the hostages held in the US Embassy in Teheran by Iranian students.
