

**In the News**

The verbal attacks and counterattacks continue in the 22nd day of the crisis in the US Embassy in Tehran where 49 Americans are still being held by Iranian students. The Ayatollah Khomeini has denounced America and claims no responsibility for the Iranian students' actions. He has warned Washington of the possible deaths of the hostages if the US stages a military rescue at the Embassy. President Carter has countered with a threat of some kind of military force if the hostages are not freed and has said that "the consequences of harm to any single hostage will be extremely grave". A stalemate is the current situation with neither side accepting the responsibility of a first move. The Shah of Iran, the pawn in the battle, is still in New York under treatment for cancer.

The first relief flight direct from America to Cambodia was a success. On Saturday, over 77,000 pounds of food and medical supplies arrived, sponsored by Operation California and the American Friends Service Committee. More flights are planned.
