

In the News

The U.N. Security Council yesterday postponed debate on the Iranian crisis until Saturday night so that the acting Foreign Minister of Iran, Abolhassan Bani Sadr, may attend. Iran requested the delay on grounds of making policy decisions and because of important religious holidays. However, the Ayatollah says he will reject any decisions from the Security Council which he feels is "under direct influence of the United States". Khomeini yesterday ordered the Iran military on alert to fight the "satanic power" of the United States, if it becomes necessary. Newspapers reported that "paratroopers in full battle dress" were seen in Tehran's airport and that the Iranian navy "started defensive operations" in the Persian Gulf.
