

In the News

The United States yesterday petitioned the International Court of Justice, charging that Iran is holding 49 American hostages in the American Embassy under "inhumane conditions". The United States asked the Court to order Iran to free all the hostages. US officials said that this action was part of the American effort to try every legal remedy to return the hostages before taking possible military retaliation. President Carter has given Khomeini an ultimatum to free the 49 Americans or face as yet unnamed severe reprisals from the US.
