Gathering more and more supportive and favorable opinions from other nations of the world for the US plight, the UN Security Council has progressed closer to denouncing the Iranian crisis, saying the hostages must be freed and the dilemma resolved. However, the delegate from Kuwait stated the fact that, although Iran's actions are deplorable, the Iranian people do have legitimate grievances which should be heard. As yet, the Security Council has not settled on a resolution. Meanwhile, the Shah of Iran was spirited out of New York and flown to a Texas Air Force base for the purpose of further convalescence until a permanent place of exile can be found. In Iran, citizens are now voting on a new constitution which will give the Ayatollah Khomeini full dictatorial powers for life, powers he has already had in fact since the resignation of the Bazargan government last month.
