In the News

Although ballot counting continues, no one will be surprised to hear of the overwhelming referendum victory by Khomeini and his Islamic State. Some US officials feel, however, that his win could lay the groundwork for a peaceful and safe return of the hostages and a resolution to the Iranian crisis. A new dark side of the dilemma is Iran's Central Bank's announcement that any exported Iranian oil may not be purchased with US dollars. Before Monday's concert in Cincinnati by The Who, 11 people were trampled and smothered to death and 20 more injured in the process of the crowd's pushing through 2 small doors to enter the Coliseum. The deaths were blamed on "festival seating" where half of the 18,000 fans, who had purchased general admission tickets, were all pushing to get good seats.
