

In the News

As both Iran and the United States jockey for position to resolve the crisis in Tehran, they each are resorting to diplomatic plans involving international investigating forums. Iran's Foreign Minister Ghotbzadeh's plan is to organize a panel of Iranians and disinterested world figures to make judgment on "crimes by the US Government in Iran". The primary "crime" is the 1953 CIA-backed overthrow of Prime Minister Mossadegh in order to replace the Shah on the throne. President Carter's plan is to offer, in exchange for the 49 hostages held now for the 36th day, the establishment of a truly international forum. The forum would allow Iran to air its grievances against the US and to expound on the Shah's crimes against Iran. Presently special emissaries from several foreign governments, who have been coached in the US for days by Carter, are arriving in Iran to begin discussion of the President's plan.
