### In the News

The Shah of Iran has accepted an offer of permanent exile from Panama and has left the United States for the Panamanian island of Contadora. As the Iranian students had declared many days earlier, they plan to begin the trials of the hostage Americans since the Shah has not been returned from the US to Iran for trial of his "crimes" in Iran. Meanwhile, the International Court of Justice in the Hague yesterday ordered Iran to free the Americans: Iran spurned that edict.

President Carter has decided to end economic sanctions against Rhodesia as of midnight last night. Formal talks have ended between Britain and the Patriotic Front guerrillas without establishing a cease-fire between the warring Rhodesian factions. However, US State Dept. officials say that "the proposals that are on the table are fair, and we felt there were no reasonable justifications for keeping the sanctions". Rhodesia is now under formal British control after 14 years of "illegal rule" by the all-white government lead by Ian Smith. Impartial elections and majority (black) rule must now be Britain's goal.
