President Carter presented his State of the Union message Sunday highlighted domestically by the smallest national deficit since 1973 and a no tax-out policy unless the recession worsens. Regarding foreign policy, Carter presented to Congress a military and economic aid plan for Pakistan, currently fearing a Soviet invasion. Carter also reiterated that the release of the American hostages in Teheran is a prerequisite to a "new and mutually beneficial relationship" with Iran, also fearing the Soviets nearby in Afghanistan.
