In the News

A two-year cat and mouse game between FBI undercover agents and a US Senator and several congressional representatives has ended with the congressmen possibly facing criminal charges of bribery. Acting on an undisclosed informant's word, agents posed as an Arab sheik or as his representatives and allegedly paid hundreds of thousands of dollars in cash to the congressmen in return for aid in the Arab's financial investments. A federal grand jury will decide the case.

On Saturday, Kenya joined a growing group of countries supporting the US in a possible boycott of the Moscow Olympics and in the idea of a change of the site of the 1980 Games. Meanwhile, American war scholars report that the Soviets have suffered a casualty rate of 500 men per week during the 5 weeks their forces, numbering 80,000, have been fighting in Afghanistan. Casualties are inflicted by civilian sniping, by guerrillas, and by direct combat with the Afghan Army.
