

In the News

As the American hostages in Tehran entered their 94th day of captivity, Abolhassan Bani Sadr was sworn in as Iran's first president by Khomeini, still remaining in a Tehran hospital after suffering a mild heart attack. Khomeini's support should afford Bani Sadr a great deal of political power during at least the beginning of his four-year presidential term. The clean-up and search for bodies continues within the state penitentiary in Santa Fe, New Mexico, where at least 39 inmates were brutally tortured and murdered during a takeover of the prison by over 250 rebellious inmates. The bloodshed, allegedly against suspected informers, and uncontained destruction of the facility by fires and breakage lead many penal and legislative figures to wonder if the buildings are worth reconstruction.
