In the News

The 5-man UN commission to investigate the former Shah of Iran and his Iranian rule has arrived in Teheran to begin its work. However, the release of the 50 American hostages, in their 114th day of captivity, no longer seems to depend upon its existence, says Khomeini. Khomeini has urged the militant students to uphold their original demand of the extradition of the Shah to Iran; he indicates the release of the hostages will come no earlier than the April parliamentary elections. President Carter's protest that the commission was sent "not only to hear Iran's grievances, but also to bring about an early end to the crisis" went unheeded.
