

In the News

Despite Soviet vows of withdrawal in Afghanistan once "outside interference" is removed, there is evidence of a widespread Soviet buildup in the small country. Construction of long-term facilities (barracks, clubs, radio stations) has begun, and US officials say water wells are being dug to tide the Soviet forces over through the long, dry summer. Also, troop reinforcement and a Soviet-Afghan border troop buildup have been evident within the last week. A spring offensive may be in its formative stages, both to squelch the Afghan rebels and to answer the US demand for an early Soviet withdrawal.

The State Department is planning a packaged microcosm of time during confinement for the 50 American hostages held in Tehran. All the current and important events are being logged into hour-long tapes to reacquaint the hostages with day-to-day American living and to help them readjust to their future freedom. Meanwhile, the UN Commission in Tehran finds itself busy with hearing Iranian grievances and helping to alleviate US-Iran tensions. However, it has yet to meet with the 50 hostages as Foreign Minister Ghotbzadeh has promised.
