With Russian troops still in Afghanistan and seemingly preparing an escalation in their fight against rebel troops, President Carter has told the US athletes that they will not participate in the 1980 Summer Olympic Games in Moscow. However, Olympic committees of 16 European nations have rejected Carter's boycott proposal and do not want an alternative game sight. Autonomy of each nation's Olympic committee and the idea that sports should be apolitical are the two dominant factors in the nations' decisions.
