In the News

Under a US threat of political and economic sanctions against Iran if Iran did not take steps to transfer the hostages from the militants in the US Embassy to the Revolutionary Council, President Bani-Sadr yesterday agreed to the transfer if the US indicates we " will not attack Iran . . . are not conspiring against us . . . will not undertake any further actions against us . . ". However, a concurrent and conflicting statement by Khomeini ruling out any possible resolution now, considering US inferred support of the Shah, leaves the crisis unchanged and still in limbo.
