Dear Wm:

I reached yesterday in
Wilmington time - Confirmed
5. and lectured in the evening
Came down to day with Thomas
boylass found your good letter
of the 10. of Mar: and the an-
nual letters from Dry? - & No-
lotia. The latter are most im-
portant and were most oppor-
tunely for the Appendix which
is now ~~being~~ settling up. -
The official papers from St.
Johns must be added & this
will require another form & per-
haps a day's more time. So
that if I bring many of the
Books with me to Gen: - I
I can not get off till Thurs-
day or Friday -
John Kilbourn is dead. P. Chase

P.S. I thank you for the hint
about Galileo. You are
right.
