Dinner bar
12 Mar 1882

We set off (the Driver and myself) yesterday about 9. AM from Circleville for this place: & tho' through the facility of our Horse we were greatly impeded: but nevertheless arrived here in the evening about 7.

The affairs at Circleville are proving missing.


I bought 4 bushels of Clover seed for the benefit of our College pastures & shall bring it with me next week to Germantown - Will
I shall go today to Worthington & return on Monday hither: when I trust our Book will be ready. I believe I must send it by mail every day.
John Killam is very sick.

it to Mr. G. Denison with my compli-

that as it is probable the Duanel
of Kenyon College will end in
driving me from the Hill I
devised that I may have some
evidence what part I have acted




Free to Chase. Wm. Gambier Ohio.
