SUBJECT: Discontinuance of U.S. Army Mail Services, APO 887


---

In accordance with U.S. Army regulations, effective immediately, all civilian organizations and personnel employed therein shall no longer be able to use U.S. Army mail services for APO 887. AJDC is included in the list of civilian organizations affected by this order. Therefore, it is now necessary to use international mail channels for all mail to and from the United States, instead of the former APO 887 service. Please inform all your correspondents of this change immediately.

Mail already en route with the APO 887 address is expected to be forwarded as in the past; however, all future mail must go through international mail channels. The proper form of address to be used in sending mail to our Paris office is:

This order affects only APO 887; use of APO facilities for other areas (Germany, Austria etc.) will continue until further advice.
