May 25. 1832

My dear Wife

I am perfectly well, and doing well. Don't be alarmed at my being detained from home. If you should not see me till the middle of June. Don't be uneasy: All is working for the best

Something has gotten into the Papers about the Indians being troublesome. Pay no regard to it.

I have only time to say that I preach every Sunday to attentive audiences and find friendly people and a most pleasant country. Plenty of Fish and Prairie Turn.
