JAPAN ENGLISH FELLOWS PROGRAM —If you are a recent graduate (or will graduate in May, '82) from a US college or university, holding a bachelor's degree, have excellent English-speaking skills (pronunciation, intonation, voice projection, etc.), have some interest in Japanese culture, and would consider yourself to be a reasonably mature, outgoing person, you may want to learn more about the Mombusho English Fellows Program. Sponsored by the Japanese Ministry to Education (Mombusho) since 1974 and co-administered by CIEE, the program assigns selected Fellows to work for 1 year with prefectural boards of education in Japan. Fellows work under the supervision of the Japanese English Teaching Consultants for junior and senior high schools. Fellows are not employed as classroom teachers, but serve as a resource for teacher training seminars, prepare language tapes, judge speech contests, or conduct classes in English. Fellows depart the USA on 6/29/82 for one year. Applications for the 1982 program must be submitted by 1/4/82.
