In the News

After four days of the summit conference at Camp David among President Anwar Sadat of Egypt, Prime Minister Begin of Israel, and President Carter, it appears that tenuous progress has been made on various points of the Middle East dilemma. However, unless further compromises are reached, many officials feel Sadat will proclaim a complete breakdown of the conference rather than accept solutions that only partially meet the Egyptians' goals for a peaceful settlement with Israel.

The compromised natural gas bill comes before the Senate today as the core of President Carter's energy program. Although the bill has changed radically from what Carter once proposed, he urges passage to show the world "a symbol of our national will" to fight our energy problems. The current gas legislation proposes gradual and complete deregulation of new gas by 1985, instead of price control maintenance. A long range consequence of this bill may be a steadily increasing consumption of natural gas instead of a curtailment as Carter had hoped.

In the News

With the nine-day summit conference at Camp David nearing its end, President Carter cautiously hopes to seal an agreement on a peace-seeking outline for further negotiations between Egypt's Anwar Sadat and Menachem Begin of Israel. Until this conference, negotiations had been broken off between the nations of the Middle East since January of 1978.
President Anastasio Somoza of Nicaragua declared martial law over his embattled country Thursday as the national guard continued its fight against rebels trying to defeat Somoza. Over 400 persons have died in massive street fighting, but Red Cross workers have been hampered by close gunfire in giving their aid. Senator Frank Church (D-Idaho) suggested the U.S. withdraw economic aid in order to bring Somoza's early downfall.

In the News

As the Camp David summit conference drew to a close yesterday, there appeared little optimism that there would be a formulation of what President Carter called a "framework for negotiation" for future attempts to settle the Middle East hostilities. Important areas of differences have not been resolved between Egypt's Sadat and Begin of Israel although both sides feel all issues have been laid open for discussion.

Electric and natural gas consumers may be shocked to find that those utility prices increased twice as much last year as the total increase throughout the years 1948 to 1973. A government survey determined the increase to be \$13.4 billion, 65% for electricity, 35% for natural gas. Fuel adjustment clauses play the villain for most of that increase felt by consumers.

In the News

Following the end of the Camp David summit conference, U.S. Secretary of State Cyrus Vance met with King Hussein of Jordan to persuade him to accept the "framework for peace." Vance apparently pressured Hussein by saying that non-compliance with the accord could threaten U.S.-Jordanian relations; Jordan is heavily dependent on the U.S. for economic and military aid. However, Hussein gave no assurance to Vance that Jordan will form a united Arab front. Jordan is particularly concerned about the fate of the West Bank of the Jordan River, its future Palestinian neighbor, and about territories presently occupied by Israel.

As President Anwar Sadat went home to Egypt to be met with a cheering welcome by thousands, Israelis in the settlements of the Sinai have more ambivalent feelings about the peace. Peace to them would mean loss of their homes; the Israeli Parliament could vote to save the settlements, but that act would crumble the Camp David peace framework. Prime Minister Begin of Israel, who also has an as-yet-unoccupied home in the Sinai, prefers to comply with Sadat's terms of Israeli withdrawal from the Sinai in order to achieve peace.

The new tax cut bill, almost certain to pass this year in Congress, will not offer as much relief as it seems. Higher Social Security taxes and wage inflation, placing incomes in higher tax brackets, will offset a good deal of the general tax cut. Some benefit will be felt by married couples with children, while childless couples and single persons will be offered less of a cut.

The body of Pope John Paul I was moved into St. Peter's Basilica to lie in state until Wednesday when the funeral mass will take place. On October 14, the cardinals will begin again to choose a new pope, only seven weeks after John Paul I was selected.

During 1977, 12.9 million cars were recalled by the auto makers of Detroit to correct faulty parts or dangerous equipment; that is almost 4 million more than the number produced in 1977 - 9.3 million.

In the News

Middle East peacetalks will open formally in Washington on Thursday between the foreign and defense ministers of Egypt and Israel. President Carter will emphasize the importance the U.S. places on the hopes for peace by opening the initial talks. The dilemma of Israeli settlements on the West Bank and in the Sinai will have to be resolved before any peace framework is solidified.

A three-day-old cease fire in Beirut was threatened by serious sniper fighting at meeting points of the Christian and Moslem sectors of the city. Previously, Syrians and Christian Le-banese engaged in a 10-day war that has killed over 1,300 and wounded 2,000.

In the News

King Khaled of Saudi Arabia, recouperating in Cleveland from open heart surgery, was visited Wednesday by Secretary of State Cyrus Vance. They talked of the cease-fire in Lebanon and U.S. hopes of the Saudis' continual help in keeping that peace.

President Carter's "most important domestic issue" went to the House Thursday after a combined House-Senate committee settled on the compromised energy tax bill. There are no primary tax increases, and Carter's tax on domestic crude oil and industrial use of gas and oil was eliminated. There are tax credits provided for home insulation, solar-heated homes, and industrial purchase of energy-saving equipment. Still to be fought out in Congress is the gradual deregulation of natural gas.

In the News

- With the adjournment of the 95th Congressional session should come passage of President Carter's tax and energy proposals. A conference committee worked over the weekend on a compromise tax bill that would please Carter by settling on a tax cut much lower than the Senate's \$29.3 billion cut Carter called inflationary and outlandish. Already settled was a reduction in maximum capital gains tax rate for persons over 55. The energy package was nearly passed by the Senate but was delayed temporarily by various challenges by opponent Sen. Abourezk (D-S.D.).
- On Saturday the 111 cardinals were sealed in the Sistine Chapel to begin the conclave that ends only after selecting a new pope to succeed Pope John Paul I, who reigned only 34 days. In pre-conclave conferences, there appeared no favorites. During the conclave, there will be 4 votes a day and no debates.
- Arab foreign ministers are meeting in Lebanon south of Beirut to try to lessen the tension in the war-torn country. Nations comprising the Arab Deterrent Force (primarily Syria) have representatives at the meeting. Meanwhile, sniper fire and shelling in Beirut fail to make the week-old "cease-fire" a reality.

In the News

- In a surprise announcement Friday, President Carter told reporters that the Middle East Peace Talks would be delayed temporarily. He said Foreign Minister Moshe Dayan and Defense Minister Ezer Weizman had been called back to Israel by Prime Minister Begin to discuss a new proposal by the United States. The news was unexpected since Carter had been insisting as late as Thursday that there were no serious problems. It is likely that the U.S. proposal concerns the future of the Israeli-held West Bank and Gaza strip and the possibility of eventual Palestinian habitation there. Egypt desires Israeli withdrawal from these two pieces of land over a period of time, a controversial subject that was not resolved during the recent Middle East Peace Agreement signed in Washington.
- Pope John Paul II, formerly Cardinal Karol Wojtyla of Krakow and the first non-Italian pope in 455 years, said Friday that all men are God's children. He called for religious freedom throughout the world yet was careful not to mention either the communist atheistic beliefs or the controversy in the Mideast.
- The controversy over the Firestone "500" steel-belted radial tire was resolved Friday when the firm agreed to recall over 10 million of the tires. It will be one of the largest recalls in history; according to Firestone Chairman Richard A. Riley, it "could potentially cost Firestone in excess of \$200 million." The investigation into the "500" tire arose following a number of serious accidents involving the tire, including several deaths.

Palestinian Liberation Organization chief Yasser Arafat has condemned the peace plan worked out in Washington for Palestinian self-rule on the West Bank of Jordan and the Gaza strip. Arafat said that the PLO would fight against the plan "with all our potentials" and that "what they are offering the Palestinian people in Camp David is a new slavery for an unlimited period of time."

President Carter's anti-inflation program picked up a new ally in Federal Reserve Chairman G. William Miller, who called the program "a balanced, concerted and sustained program to fight inflation." Carter seeks approval not only from those who set the nation's interest rate policies, but also from business and labor, who so far like Carter's promise to cut government spending and a rejection of mandatory wage-price controls.

In the News

Pravda, the official Communist newspaper, reported recently that the talks in Moscow between Foreign Minister Gromyko and Secretary of State Vance were productive and that a new strategic arms treaty might be signed soon. The newspaper warned, however, that American arms race proponents could ruin the treaty's chances of survival and called for a spirit of good feeling between the two countries.

- President Carter spent Sunday relaxing at Camp David after having campaigned for Democratic candidates in New York, Massachusetts, Connecticut, and Maine the day before. At those campaign rallies, Carter announced that he had convinced Egyptian President Anwar Sadat not to have his negotiators recalled to Cairo. Sadat is angered by a continuing buildup of Israeli settlements in occupied lands. Israeli Prime Minister Begin has publicly defended the right of Israelis to settle in those areas. A "sickout" by employees of Pan American Airlines entered its third day, delaying many flights
- indefinately. Workers have been calling in sick to protest their lack of a contract for nearly a year.

In the News

In response to the Shah's recently imposed martial law, Iranian oil workers began a national strike yesterday. They are demanding an end to martial law, the release of all political prisoners, and the trial of many allegedly corrupt political figures. The strike has shut down production of most major oil wells, refineries, and petro-chemical plants. Experts have estimated that Iran will lose over \$60 million a day from the strike; the United States alone imports 980,000 barrels a day from Iran, about 1/8th of all US oil imports. Despite worries about the "angry" correspondence between Israeli Prime Minister Begin and President Carter concerning continued Israeli settling in occupied terratories, the peace talks between the Egyptian and Israeli foreign ministers progressed smoothly yesterday. The talks resumed after a ten-day hiatus, during which the two governments privately studied and revised the treaty's terminology. Prime Minister Begin told reporters that a finished treaty could be ready in time for the Nobel Prize ceremonies on December 10, 1978.

In the News

Despite an 11 point drop of the Dow Jones Average yesterday, the dollar continued its slow recovery on international money markets. It made a 4% increase against the Japanese yen and also improved against European currencies. The partial recovery is due to the emergency economic plan which Carter announced Wednesday. Some provisions of the plan are 1) the loan of \$30 billion in foreign money to the United States in order to bolster our currency by buying up surplus dollars, 2) sharply increased sales of gold by the US Treasury, and 3) the increase of the Federal Reserve prime interest rate to 9.5%. President Carter continued his campaigning for Democratic candidates yesterday in New York at a rally for Governor Hugh Carey. There he surprised reporters by announcing that he would meet with Israeli Prime Minister Menachem Begin later that day after Begin's morning meeting with Secretary of State Vance. Carter's meeting possibly was formulated to squelch rumors of ill feeling between the two heads of state after their disagreement on new Israeli settlements on the West Bank and the Gaza Strip.

NEWSCOPE

In the News

Over the weekend representatives were sent to Cairo from 20 Arab nations meeting in Baghdad with promises of vast sums of monetary aid to Egypt if President Sadat would renounce the Camp David peace agreements. Sadat refused to meet with the delegation; as a result, the Baghdad Conference will probably impose political and economic sanctions on Egypt. Rioting by anti-government protestors continued throughout Teheran, Iran, this weekend as fires were set in houses, hotels, and cars. Many students tried to pull down a statue of the Shah on the Teheran University campus; government troops were called in to stop them, supposedly killing 65. Later in the day, the rioters marched on the American and British Embassies, setting fire to the latter. The Iranian military has placed a dusk-to-dawn curfew on the city in an attempt to prevent the worst rioting in Iran in over a decade. There are more troubles for the beleaguered <u>New York Times</u> and the <u>New York Daily News</u>. During final negotiations on Saturday to settle the pressmen's union strike, which has closed down two of the country's largest papers since August 6, 1978, the reporters and editors of the Times also decided to strike due to a recent cut in their life insurance and health benefits. This turn of events will probably exclude the chance of the two papers resuming publication today as was formally scheduled.

He swears his past governing mistakes will not be repeated and that free elections will follow cessation of violence and chaos.

The GOP picked up 6 governorships.

In the News

Partisan groups immediately and forcefully criticized President Carter's attempt to curb future inflation by vetoing three bills he felt dangerous to the economy. Farmers disparaged his veto of a bill which would have limited his ability to import cheaper foreign beef. The textile industry disliked Carter's veto of a bill restricting lower textile tariffs. Student nurses lost a bill providing for huge sums for their training programs, a veto they called discriminatory. Carter responded by saying that "no part of our economy can be exempt if the nation is to reduce inflation."

President Carter has signed his energy bill, a composite of compromises that few feel will produce a strong national energy program.

In a nationally broadcast interview on "Face the Nation", Presidental aide Hamilton Jordan said that the President is considering presenting the US-USSR S.A.L.T. pact to the Senate as an agreement, not as a treaty. An agreement requires majority approval, while a treaty requires a two-thirds majority.

In the News

The grim story of the mass suicides on November 18 in Jonestown, Guyana continues as over 900 bodies are being transported from there to Dover Air Force Base, Delaware for identification and burial by their families. The followers of the Rev. Jim Jones died by either voluntary or forced cyanide poisoning or gunshot wounds following an ambush of US Rep. Leo Ryan and a press crew in Guyana to investigate rumors of mistreatment and brain-washing of the cult members, most of whom came from Ryan's California constituency. Authorities now are investigating the legitimacy of the Jonestown settlement and the apparent paranoid dictatorship of Jones, spurred on by his "divine calling". Stephan Jones, the leader's son, affirms that his father was insane and held some members by force and others by demonic charisma. The suicides ended the belief of the followers that they had found a refuge and a life free from troubled responsibility. Yet Mark Lane, lawyer for the group and a witness to the deaths, claimed "they were smiling . . . " It is martyrdom beyond belief.

"It's like a souffle. When it's ready, it's ready - and it's almost ready," said Sen. Jacob Javits (R-NY) regarding the Mideast peace agreement. He and several other senators believe Israel and Egypt will reconcile their remaining differences over the settlements on the West Bank and Gaza Strip, but not before Dec. 10 when Begin and Sadat will be awarded the Nobel Peace prize for their efforts to bring peace to the Middle East.

In the News

On Monday morning the mayor of San Francisco, George Moscone and a newly-appointed city supervisor, Harvey Milk, were shot and killed by former supervisor Dan White. The slayings apparently stem from the fact that White is a staunch political conservative and strongly opposed Milk, an avowed homosexual. Moscone was a liberal mayor and political foe of White. White had resigned from his position of supervisor on Nov. 10, 1978, saying that his \$9,600 salary could not support his family. On Nov. 14, White asked the Mayor to be reinstated but was refused, a decision urged by Milk. Mayor Moscone is the first American mayor to be assassinated since Anton Cermak, mayor of Chicago, was killed in 1933. In the primary election for the presidency of the Liberal-Democratic Party in Japan on Monday, Massayoshi Ohira defeated Prime Minister Takeo Fukuda. The leader of the ruling party in Japan has traditionally become the Prime Minister, and Ohira is scheduled to take Fukuda's place in ten days.

With the 112th Ohio General Assembly about to close its records, President Carter is angered by the lawmakers' vote of a 28% pay increase for all Assembly members. The Illinois legislature enacted a similarly enlarged salary for itself, much over the voluntary guideline of 7% Carter suggested for future wage increases. Carter feels these newly fattened paychecks are a bad example for the rest of the country. Ohio congressmen argue, however, that the new salary of \$22,500, their first raise in 4 years, is just enough to cover expenses since they are allotted no expense account by the state. The Moslem holy month in Iran, Moharram, was entered Saturday with bloody riots and protests against the Shah. Government armored trucks and soldiers fought the rioters in the streets. Then they cleaned up the bloody aftermath of what the Shah expects to be only the beginning of a month of heavy fighting and loss of lives resulting from religious fervor directed

In the News

Yesterday Pioneer-Venus-1 sent back its first data from the atmosphere of Venus, 33 million miles away. Sections of the space craft will descend toward the surface of the planet and radio back more detailed information of Venus' atmosphere.

The "Southern Crescent" train which derailed Sunday near Shipman, Va., killing 6 people and injuring 60 more, is reported to have been speeding. Tape recordings of engine speed show that the train was travelling at 80 m.p.h., 35 m.p.h. over the limit, when it met a curve in the tracks.

Dianne Feinstein was elected Mayor of San Francisco on Monday by the city's Board of Supervisors. Ms. Feinstein had been acting Mayor since last Monday when Mayor George Moscone was assassinated by Dan White, a former city supervisor. White has confessed to the slaying.

Pete Rose, formally of the Cincinnati Reds, ended his long contract negotiations yesterday by signing a 4-year, \$3.2 million contract with the Philadelphia Phillies. Rose is now the highest-paid player in baseball history.

In the News

Soviet Party Chief Leonid Brezhnev told Secretary of the Treasury W. Michael Blumenthal and Secretary of Commerce Juanita Kreps on Wednesday that the Soviet Union wants an increase in trade between our two countries and a new SALT treaty "without further procrastination." However, Mr. Brezhnev added that Soviet-American trade will continue to decline as long as the United States insists on tying trade to emigration and human rights issues.
Kirill Kondrashin, one of the foremost symphony conductors of the U.S.S.R., has gone into hiding in the Netherlands and has asked for residence permission. In 1972, Kondrashin was given the country's highest artistic award, but he claimed that his artistic freedom is being stifled in Russia. Once a director of the Bolshoi Theater and the U.S.S.R. symphony orchestra, Kondrashin just completed a 2-week engagement as the guest conductor for the Amsterdam Symphony. Kondrashin's wife originally defected with the director but has since returned to Russia and to her three grown children.

President Carter will meet on the French Caribbean island of Guadelupe on January 5th and 6th with English Prime Minister James Callaghan, West German Chancellor Helmut Schmidt, and French President Valery Giscard D'Estaing to discuss international affairs. Carter is also scheduled to visit Mexico in February.

In the News

People throughout the world mourned the death of Golda Meir after it was announced last Friday. She had led a life of total political service to her country. Born in 1898 in what was then the Russian Empire, her family emigrated to the United States when Golda was only 8. Returning to Palestine, she became the Secretary of the Women's Labor Council. In 1934 she joined Histadrut which would become the Israeli government in 1948. At that time she was one of the 25 signers of Israel's Declaration of Independance; during the same year she helped raise over \$50 million for Israel's fight against Egypt, Syria, Iraq, and Lebanon. In 1956 she became the Foreign Minister under the leadership of Prime Minister David Ben-Gurion. In 1969 she became Prime Minister and led the country in the 1973 war. Golda Meir will be buried Tuesday in a spot next to Levi Eshkol, Israel's third Prime Minister and near the grave of Dr. Theodore Herzl, the founder of Zionism.

Cuban President Fidel Castro is initiating a new era of less restrictive government stemming from a feeling of more confidence in his own regime. In the spring of 1978, Castro opened the door to U.S. visitors and is now allowing the freedom of his political prisoners, most of whom will emigrate to the U.S. He is also permitting exiled families to return to visit relatives. Castro is indirectly seeking more concrete relations with the U.S., a fact which officials here have yet to fully comprehend and explore.

In the News

At his news conference yesterday in Washington, President Carter appeared confident about the track record of his administration; he said he had decided about running for re-election in 1980 but would not reveal his decision until later. The President also mentioned the "good progress" made in US-Soviet relations and hinted at a possible summit conference with Soviet President Brezhnev in the coming months, provided key issues have been settled. The attorney for Dan White, the man accused of murdering San Francisco Mayor George Moscone and Supervisor Harvey Milk, said that White believes the whole situation is a dream. White cannot understand why he is in jail and will plead innocent to the charges on the grounds of insanity.

Pioneer Venus 2 has radioed back flawlessly from Venus, Earth's nearest planetary neighbor, by means of several probes sent to the surface. Scientists discover that the planet's surface registers 900°F. and that atmospheric pressure is 100 times greater than on the Earth at sea level. The spacecraft was launched from Cape Canaveral on August 8, 1978.

Latest Egyptian peace proposals carried by Secretary of State Vance to Israel were met by a negative and absolute response from Prime Minister Begin. He indicated, however, that negotiations will cordially continue, but that no final peace agreement will be signed by the anticipated date of December 17. President Carter has informed the U.S. public that our economy is sound and warns that recession

is in our future only if we expect one and do nothing to prevent it. As a result, there will be a Joint Economic Committee hearing on the dollar dilemma and the failing international monetary system. Rep. Henry Reuss (D-Wis.) has suggested bolstering the dollar with other international money.
