ECON 79 will be offered this semester as a seminar but the approach will be a bit different from that in previous years. The focus of analysis will be non-Marxist paradigms in economics: supply side economics (neo-conservative paradigm), humanistic economics (an alternative paradigm within the western system of thought) and buddhist economics (a non-western paradigm).
