 of three years.

To such as will bring to him the  
 recommendation of <sup>the Rev</sup> Josiah Pratt  
 and Peter Roe of <sup>Trillick</sup> London, the Bishop will engage  
 to pay each annually the sum of  
 five hundred Dollars.

Their duties will be to preach  
 the gospel in new settlements &  
 to gather together congregations  
 & form parishes.
