STUDENTS AND FACULTY: Summer study in Poland. The Kosciuszko Foundation is sponsoring nine summer sessions in Poland, at 3 sites, with hundreds of participants expected in 1983. Students and adults may participate in these special programs for foreigners conducted at Poland's leading universities and cultural centers. Minimum requirement is high school graduation. All programs, which are 3-6 weeks long, include tours in Poland as well as classroom and extra-curricular activities. For most programs, no previous knowledge of the Polish language is required, and college credit may be possible. Complete costs, inclusive of tuition, full room and board, travel in Poland and roundtrip trans-atlantic airfare, are approximately \$1,500. At the Jagiellonian Univ. - Cracow, The Catholic Univ. of Lublin, the Adam Mickiewicz Univ. - Pozan: Write to Summer Sessions, the Kosciuszko Foundation, 15 E. 65th St., NY, NY 10021. Application deadline is 2/15.

JUNIORS AND SENIORS: Kosciuszko Foundation Scholarship Programs. The Kosciuszko Foundation has available a number of awards for Americans of Polish descent for graduate studies at American colleges and universities in whatever field they choose. Scholarships are also available for graduate study in any area of Polish Studies (Lit., History, Art Hist., Language) for Polish-Americans and Americans of non-Polish descent. Applications for college aid for study below the graduate level are discouraged. Anyone wishing to apply should first send a letter of inquiry to the Grant Officer at the Foundation's address and request an application and the scholarship guidelines. The deadline for the 1983-4 academic year is 1/15/83. The Foundation offers a Year Abroad Program for those wishing to spend a year at a Polish university. Research and post-doctoral study grants in Poland for American scholars are also available. The deadline for research and study in Poland applications is 1/15.
