Letter to Philander Chase

Londra March 12th
1838

My dear Bishop Chase

I begged my husband
to make a request for me which
I find he has forgotten, and as
he has closed his letter, I shall
have the pleasure of doing it my-
self, which gives me the oppor-
tunity of assuring you how
often you are in our thoughts
and how much we have sym-
pathized with you & your
family in your various trials

When you were in England
you repeated to us a little Poem
on the words, "I would not live
always" - I thought it very
beautiful, and have often
regretted that I did not ask
you for a copy of it - My request
is that when you next write to
Mr Pratt you will be kind
enough to send it me.

I wish also to express my
Christian love & esteem for
Mrs Chace, who has borne with
you the "burden & heat of the day"

and has made herself a pattern
to all Christian wives by her
unwearied faith & labour, in
strengthening the hands of her
husband, in all his difficulties
