- 9 - Went to Jacksonville & preached in the evening.

administered the Holy Communion and preached the Rev. Mr. Hatch
elder read prayers. Was ill and did not preach in the evening
the weather was inclement and wet.
11. Wrote to several Bishops - viz Griswold - Brownell - B.T. Onder-
donk. - Doane. - Hopkins - and sent a copy of my reasons for not
ordaining Mr Lovejoy -

It rains - but I must set off for Alton. I go by the way of Na-
hles and there take the boat.

My complaint which is a lax state of the bowels is
hoping off by the free use of C. Oil & Laudanum -

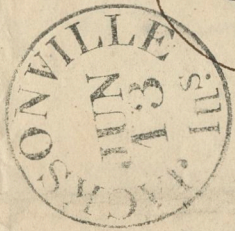
In great haste and with a prayerful heart
