My dearest Brother:

I have just returned to this City and among many ^{other} friends your letter very acceptable letter of the 2^d. last month - I thank God and rejoice exceedingly that you and all the dear ones are well in Randolph and Bethel & Royston! Give my best love to them one and all and say thus.

- I do not expect to return to my family as I stated in time to attend my convention on the first of June. - shall write them - that my duty keeps me on the ground here where there is a heart to give to noble objects till I have obtained sufficient to preserve hopes of success in the great object of Tubster College.

This determination will enable me to pay a visit to my dear relatives - you and all ~~those~~ whom I love above all the world beside - my own dear ones in the Robin nest alone excepted.

I believe I sent you my appeal —
since its being printed; there is subscribed
(part promised & part collected) more
than one thousand dollars. —

Besides this I hear of 150⁰ being sent
from England for Jubilee!

Friends in this diocese in-
sist on my staying to the Con-
secration of the Wh: Elect S. Carolina
It is thought Mr Doane will
come on by the 20th of this month
— Mr. Meade being previously
-engaged.
