If nothing from these treme difficulty of the times, be given to your glorion Sjut now; om heads vill be in = forma of the facts, and our hearts warmed with disire to give you some future day. Mismining you to unessber you noble work; and as it Truppepes you shall find willing and ready to aprict you in completing it I vice be with you before long; but when that willbe I san not now say - I must stay alittle longer in Phila - Turhaps tile Ishall have completed a Professor this tobe named after him eily of brotherlylone, of Hovor neugran buthin she set, I got the morning this morning the one at Sixth vory \$,666-46 ... If muchful, one week or a Intruight spent in purmit, will have been well employed. - I have for your mayin that I may have a steady trye to the play of god in all I do in this great matter; and that all may be ordered so as to fromote the salvation of the souls of men. We are now, both of us, very near the period then our course vill be finished and on trial over. May we so pap the remainder y our lives as This faith in Christi atonement will secure the selvation now fouls. Do give my best love to Sister Olivea Thoughton and then dolp h Ever your loving Brother Millin Thase
