My dear Bishop Chase,

I see by the papers that you have come to New York, and it is a great pleasure to me to think I shall see you again, and hear your kind voice once again in this world.

and steal over to us some day.

(You see, dear Sir, I am apprised of your active habits, or I could not make such a request) or if you will give me one line by post to tell me when & where I may find you, though it be for the shortest interview. -
