Dear Brother Dudley

A short letter is better than none  
and in my case you'll doubtless say it is  
also better than a long one: for I have nothing  
very amusing to write

My visit to Barnab was short like  
all other pleasures of this world. I staid the  
first night after leaving Proyalton at Salis-  
=bury with our niece Appia - Her husband  
took me down to Wophinton - At the latter  
place I preached as I did also at Concord -  
Our niece Hannah Whipple was de-  
lighted to see me. On Friday I came to  
Lowell there also I preached. The Rev Mr  
Edson and his wife daughter of Bishop Par-  
ker treated us with great kindness.

When arrived in this City I stop at  
Dr Stone. - On Sunday I preached twice in  
St. Paul's in the morning & in Trinity in the after-  
noon. On Monday I took Laura to N. Bedford  
when I left <sup>her</sup> with Mrs Perry & came to this City  
on Tuesday - I think I shall leave this

tomorrow evening; go to N Bedford and return on  
Friday morning with Laura & put ourselves in  
the car for Springfield Mass<sup>ts</sup> This will allow  
of our getting to Hartford by Sunday - On mon-  
day or Tuesday I shall go to N. Haven and  
perhaps to N York where you will please  
to address any letters to the care of "James L.  
DePeyster 49. South Street. N. York" -
