Dr. M. Ingraham.

Sir

I propose setting off as soon
after Easter as possible and proceeding directly
to Cairo: but can not fix the precise day
in which I shall arrive there.

I hope you'll make
arrangement for divine services and for
the organization of a Parish of our Commu-
nion under my inspection: The form of which
I have & which always is acceptable.

My wish is to proceed as soon as may
be to Vincennes that I may attend to the
few scattered sheep of Christ fold in the neighbor-
hood of St. Carmel—

Begging your prayers that God
may speed me in this my undertaking to see
you all at Cairo
